Children and youth of Somalia are rightfully entitled to education; this is fundamental for the sustaining of

Actions

- Strengthen communities, families, schools, mentors, and community Education Committees (CECs)
- Provide sponsorship to vulnerable girls and boys for them to complete primary and secondary education
- Construct/rehabilitate classrooms and WASH facilities. Provide furniture, learning materials and financial support
- Support schools to provide a more gender sensitive environment for learning
- Develop and promote extracurricular activities in schools for holistic development
- Provide functional literacy, numeracy and vocational training together with mentorship for youth with disabilities
- Establish and support job creation associations
- Support the Ministries of Education and Labour in running the vocational training department

People

- 20,300 pupils (46% girls) in 35 primary schools benefiting from the programme
- 136 teachers (43% women) supported with incentives
- 34 female teachers trained as mentors to guide girls' clubs and facilitate extra-curricular activities
- 24 mothers engaged in education support groups to encourage school enrolment and retention
- 140 CEC members (39% women) trained on education management
- 100 youth (48% women) graduated from vocational training
