Every human has the right to a life free of sexual assault, abuse and exploitation, the right to good health

## Actions

- Strengthen institutional systems for prevention, detection, and response to GBV by supporting local organizations
- Improve quality and scope of response services delivered to survivors and children at risk
- Increase knowledge on GBV; raising awareness by facilitating dialogue processes within and between communities
- Increase numbers of survivors accessing vital services through a network of community case workers
- Refer survivors to other organizations for legal support
- Economic empowerment and skills development for GBV survivors as a strategy for reducing their vulnerability
- Provide psychosocial counselling to children/youth in schools
- Child led initiatives for prevention of GBV in schools
- Research on social norms related to sexual violence and community discussions to promote positive change
- Advocacy, through participation in national and international consultations
- Increase understanding of the link between GBV and conflict through research.
- Capacity-building of staff on conflict-sensitive and innovative solutions to GBV

## People



- 4600 survivors provided with health care and/or psychosocial support

- 700 children at risk accessing counselling in school
- 370 survivors benefiting from legal services
- 150 survivors attending literacy or vocational training
- 10 schools assisted to set up children's clubs
- 1000 community members to participate in community discussions to build positive norms and re
- 260 service providers e.g. ~~Survivors, Clerics, Approach~~ police trained on
