



The following text has been elaborated on the basis of a wide internal and external consultation and was approved by the competent social bodies (Executive [03 et 23.11.2004] and Board of Directors [13.12.2004]) of CISP.

CISP joins the Charter of Donation (www.noprofit.org/adotta/carta_donazione/codice.html), elaborated thanks to the combined effort of the principal associations of the third sector and the representatives of the entrepreneurial and academic world. It formalizes the essential rules for self-regulation and transparency in fundraising.

In identifying firms and other profit subjects, private or institutional, with which to collaborate or receive funds from, CISP adopts five deontological criteria. They foresee the absence of any interaction with subjects conducting the following activities:

- a. making, selling or marketing weapons or their components;
- b. exploiting or discrimination against workers and illegal employment of juvenile labour;
- c. distributing products that have been declared harmful for the health of the population;
- d. destructing and damaging of environment;
- e. boycotting of policies oriented towards the diffusion of the rights to health and to a balanced feeding.

Such criteria are examined on the basis of a series of considerations which are designed to establish whether subjects:

1. are certified according to the SA8000 international standards, which details the norms required for the ethically correct behaviour of firms and their production divisions towards workers;
2. are included in the ethical lists formulated by the principal specialized companies, and particularly by FTSE, E.Capital Partners et Ethibel;
3. have (or adhere to) a code of conduct on corporate social responsibility and a social balance;
4. adhere to the second level associations which promote corporate social responsibility, and particularly Anima and Sodalitas.
