CISP's overall objective is to strengthen the agro-pastoralist and fishing communities' livelihood through

Our facts and figures:

In 2009, CISP's activities in the area involved a total of:

- 1,491 goats and 200 camels distributed;
- 200 families receiving 7-8 goats and one camel;
- 1,417 indirect beneficiaries, selected among drought-affected pastoralist communities, with particu

In 2010:

- 800 goats were distributed to 200 families;
- Two water pans were rehabilitated within the area of the livestock distribution;
- A section of the Hobyo-Galkayo road was rehabilitated, benefiting about 1,600 people.

Our activities:

- **Livestock** : veterinary services to improve animal health, surveillance and treatment
- **Fishing** : distribution of boats and rehabilitation of roads connecting coastal areas
- **Redistribution of resources** : purchase of livestock and redistribution to the more disadvantaged persons
- **Cash for work** : cash compensation of work (such as rehabilitation of roads and water points)
- **Market accessibility** : provision of infrastructures, as well as agricultural and livestock inputs.
